


Venue: Queens Road Baptist Church

How to Find Us

- Coventry is almost in the centre of the UK, a few miles east of Birmingham. To find us, approach the city centre by any major route. We are situated close to the centre of the city, adjacent to junction 6 of the city centre ring road. **A major redevelopment project is currently happening around the church which will result in changes in access to the church by road. - During the week the church car park can be accessed only from Grosvenor Road which is a one-way street accessible from the Ring Road (Ringway Queens) end.
- When using a Sat Nav please use CV1 3FZ this will bring you to Grosvenor Road
- At weekends and in the evenings, a further car park is available accessed from the turning circle at the end of Queens Road (next to Ringway Queens but not accessible from it).
- Queens Road is 5 minutes' walk from Coventry Railway Station



They founded Care for the Family's Widowed Young Support work and have recently developed a Bereavement Care Awareness course for churches. Joy works with Cruse Bereavement Care in many roles and is also a Counselling Practitioner with the Association of Christian Counsellors.
